## THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT, (CAP. 283)

### REGULATIONS

(Made under section 121)

THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (TOURIST HUNTING) REGULATIONS, 2015

### PART I Preliminary

Citation and commencement 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Tourist Hunting) Regulations 2015 and shall come into operation on the date of publication.

Interpretation
Cap 283

- 2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires-
- "Act" means the Wildlife Conservation Act;
- "Authorized Officer" shall have the same meaning ascribed to it under the Act;
- "block fees" means amount of money paid for the concession of a hunting area per hunting season;
- "conservation fees" means an amount of money paid by a client for hunting through a hunting company to support conservation activities:
- "Director" means the Director of Wildlife appointed under the Act;
- "game fees" means the price for an animal hunted or wounded by a tourist hunter;
- "hunting block" means an area with game animals which has been delineated or set aside and approved by the Director for trophy hunting;
- "hunting company" means a registered business enterprise allocated a hunting block by the Minister and issued a Hunting Block Allocation Certificate to undertake tourist hunting activities;
- "key animals" means a specified list of reptiles, mammals and birds as set out in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations;
- "hunting permit fee" means a sum of money paid by a hunting company or authorized association on behalf of a client to allow

- him acquire a lawful hunting licence for a specific safari package;
- "hunting term" means specified period of five years time within which a hunting company may be allocated and use a hunting Block:
- "Minister" means the Minister responsible for natural resources and tourism;
- "Observer fee" means a fee paid by an observer during hunting through a hunting company to support conservation efforts;
- "professional hunter" means a hunting person qualified and licensed by the Director to guide a hunting client during a hunting expedition;
- "professional hunters' fee" means a sum of money paid by a professional hunter per season for the purpose of permitting him to guide hunting clients in the country;
- "safari package" means and includes a list of animals hunted in a specified number of days;
- "trophy hunting" means a selective hunting of animals for any horn, ivory, tooth, tursh, bone, claw, hoof, skin, hair, feather, or other portion of any animal for the purpose of a manufactured trophy but does not entitle the permit holder to export meat; and
- "tourist hunting" means selective hunting of animals within a given hunting block for leisure or obtaining trophies thereof and includes sport hunting, trophy hunting and sport fishing but does not entitle the hunter to export meat.

## PART II PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION AND ALLOCATION OF HUNTING BLOCKS

# Establishment of Hunting Blocks

- **3**.-(1) The Director shall establish areas in the Game Reserves area, Game Controlled Areas and other areas outside protected areas to be designated as hunting blocks.
- (2) The hunting blocks to be designated in Wildlife Management Areas shall be designated and categorized by the Director together with the Resource Zone Management Plan or a General Management Plan of the respective Wildlife Management Area.
- (3) Where the hunting block is to be established from the areas outside protected areas the Director shall before designating the hunting block consult the relevant local communities and ensure they are involved in the process of establishment.

Criteria for establishing hunting block

- **4.** Where the Director wants to establish the Hunting Block in a particular area, he shall take into consideration that the area proposed meets the following criteria:
  - (a) has wildlife resources for sustainable tourist hunting;

- (b) has diverse animal species and habitats;
- (c) is accessible in terms of terrain and infrastructure development;
- (d) has potential for wildlife recovery upon a given time frame and investment;
- (e) the boundaries of the proposed hunting block are clearly demarcated by Global Positioning System (GPS) coordinates and described by permanent physical features or permanent visible marks as may be applicable; and
- (f) the size of the area is200 km² minimum except where the hunting block is designated in a Wildlife Management Area which size shall be determined in the Resources Management Zone Plan, whereas the maximum size of the area shall be determined by the area's score of the above criteria.

Categorization of hunting blocks

- **5**.-(1) The hunting blocks designated in regulation 3 shall be categorized by the Director according to the criteria prescribed in the Tenth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (2) The Director shall categorize hunting blocks in five categories in accordance with the Grade Points Average score of each hunting block calculated from the criteria specified in the Tenth Schedule as follows:
  - (a) Category I comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 3.6 to 3.1;
  - (b) Category II comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 3.0 to 2.6;
  - (c) Category III comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 2.5 to 2.1;
  - (d) Category IV comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 2.0 to 1.8; and
  - (e) Category V comprise of hunting blocks with Grade Point Average Score ranging from 1.7 and below.
- (3) The Hunting Blocks fees shall be paid according to categories prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.

Qualification for allocation of hunting block

- **6.** A person shall not be considered for allocation of a hunting block unless:
  - (a) he has a company intending to engage in hunting animals registered with the Registrar of Companies within Tanzania;
  - (b) at least one of the Directors has five years' experience in wildlife based business and conservation in Tanzania; and
  - (c) the company meets the requirement of section 39 (3) (a) of the Act.

Tenure of

7.-(1) The tenure of ownership of a hunting block shall be for a

ownership of hunting block period of five years commencing from the date to be declared by the Minister in Government *Gazette*.

- (2) Any person who is allocated a hunting block after the commencement of the tenure of ownership shall be allocated for only the remaining period of the tenure.
- (3) The Minister shall cause an in-depth analysis of the performance of all hunting companies at the third year of the hunting term in order to determine the eligibility of the renewal of allocation of hunting blocks at the end of the tenure.

Application for hunting block

- **8.-**(1) The Minister shall, on the 30<sup>th</sup> June of the fourth year of the hunting term, advertise vacant hunting blocks and inviting applications for allocation for a given hunting term.
- (2) The advertisement shall prescribe the time and place within which applicants shall submit their application.
- (3) The Minister shall subject to sub-regulation (5), advertise hunting blocks that fall vacant during a particular tenure of ownership after which any person may submit a formal application.
- (4) The Minister may allocate a hunting block that falls vacant to the next applicant, among the previous qualified applicants, provided that:
  - (a) the applicant applied for the hunting block;
  - (b) the applicant obtained the minimum score as per the evaluation of the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee and still maintains the qualifications;
  - (c) the allocation does not contravene sections 38(7) and 39(3)(b) of the Act.
- (5) The application for allocation of a hunting block under subregulation (1) shall be made in the prescribed form set out in the First Schedule to these Regulations.
- (6) For the purpose of this sub regulation, "vacant hunting block" includes hunting blocks which its tenure has not been renewed.

Application and assessment of applicant

- **9**.-(1) Each application made under regulation 8 shall be submitted to the Director together with-
  - (a) a copy of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the hunting company;
  - (b) a copy of the certificate of incorporation;
  - (c) TIN Certificate or VAT Registration number; and
  - (d) an application fee as set out in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (2) Every applicant for the hunting block allocation shall be assessed on the following criteria:
  - (a) in case of a fully Tanzanian owned hunting company, proof

of:

- (i) having a suitable office premises for carrying on the hunting business;
- (ii) having a fleet of not less than two 4WD pick up vehicles in good running condition, registered under the company's name and inspected by relevant authority;
- (iii) proof of reliable communication facilities;
- (iv) at least six tents;
- (v) two refrigerators and two freezers; and
- (vi) beds and other necessary furniture:

Provided that the applicant company may produce a Bank Bond or guarantee to the tune of at least USD 300,000.00 in lieu of the above equipment as commitment for the purchase of the equipment within three months after allocation of the hunting block.

- (b) in case of foreign owned hunting company or a company that is not fully owned by citizens proof of:
  - (i) having a suitable office premises for carrying on the hunting business;
  - (ii) evidence that the business is registered and certified by Tanzania Investment Centre;
  - (iii) having a fleet of not less than five 4WD pick up vehicles in good running condition, registered under the company's name and inspected by relevant authority;
  - (iv) reliable communication facilities;
  - (v) at least twelve tents;
  - (vi) five refrigerators and five freezers; and
  - (vii) beds and other necessary furniture:

Provided that the applicant company may produce a Bank Bond or guarantee to the tune of at least USD1,000,000.00 in lieu of the above equipment as commitment for their purchase within three months after allocation of the hunting block.

- (c) business plans;
- (d) good track record with regard to payment of fees and adherence to the Act for existing operators;
- (e) reference of any good business record; and
- (f) good track record of adherence to payment of Government taxes and other statutory payments.
- (3) Notwithstanding sub-regulation (1), the Director may, whenever necessary and for the purpose of authentication of documents, require an applicant to submit the original copies of the documents referred to under sub-regulation (1).

Fees non-

10. The application fee payable under regulation 9 (1)(d) shall

refundable

not be refundable.

Registration of application 11. The Director shall, immediately after receiving any application submitted to him pursuant to regulation 8, register the application.

Applicants to be informed

- **12**.-(1) Subject to regulation 11, after registering any applications made within the period specified under regulation 8(1), the Director shall, within fourteen days, acknowledge receipt of each application.
- (2) The Director shall submit applications referred to under subregulation (1) to the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee established under the Act.
- (3) The Minister shall, upon advice by the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee, allocate a hunting block to a successful applicant.
- (4) The Minister may, upon receiving advise from the Hunting Block Advisory Committee allocate hunting blocks that were not applied for or whose applicants failed to obtain the minimum score, to other applicants who obtained minimum score but were not allocated hunting blocks applied for due to competition.
- (5) Final decision shall be communicated to all applicants within ninety days from the final date of submission of the applications.
- (6) The provisions of Part VII of the Act that relate to tourist hunting, shall apply *mutatis mutandis*, to these Regulations.

### **PART III**

#### CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS RELATING TO HUNTING BLOCKS

Payment of fee

- 13.-(1) Any person who has been allocated a hunting block under Part II of these Regulations shall, by 15<sup>th</sup> May each year, be required to pay seasonal block fees as set out in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provision of sub-regulation (1) the person allocated hunting blocks shall be required to pay fees as set out in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (3) The Director shall, after the payment of seasonal block fees under sub regulation (1), and satisfying himself that the hunting company has utilized the hunting block in the preceding hunting season and scored at least forty of the value of the key animals as specified in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations, issue a hunting block allocation certificate in the prescribed form set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
  - (4) The level of game fees payable for any hunting license shall

be as provided in the Third Schedule to these Regulations.

(5) Any person who fails to pay any fees prescribed under this regulation commits an offence.

Conditions for transfer of a hunting block

- **14**.-(1) A person shall not transfer a hunting block user right allocated to him, unless such person obtains prior written consent from the Minister.
- (2) The transfer of a hunting block shall be made to a hunting company or a company which applied for allocation of hunting block for the existing hunting term but was not allocated due to competition.
- (3) The Minister shall within thirty days upon receipt of an application for transfer of a hunting block and proof of payment of the transfer request fee prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations-
  - (a) subject to sub regulation (2), in case shall the transferee is not a hunting company, shall obtain advice from the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee;
  - (b) in case the transferee is an existing hunting company, take into consideration the provisions of sections 38(7) and 39(3)(b) of the Act, and proceed to approve or reject the transfer.
- (4) Upon receiving the Minister's consent under sub-regulation (3), the Applicant shall:
  - (a) pay transfer fees as prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations;
  - (b) submit all agreements of transferring the hunting block;
  - (c) surrender the hunting block allocation certificate; and
  - (d) submit proof of payment of all necessary taxes and authorization as required by other laws.
- (5) The Director shall upon satisfying himself that the requirements of sub-regulation (4) have been complied with, issue a hunting block allocation certificate to the transferee.
- (6) For the purpose of this regulation, "transfer of a hunting block user right" means transfer of the hunting block user right from one hunting company to a transferee and includes a situation where majority shares in a hunting company are transferred to another person.

Duration

- **15**.-(1) The hunting block tenure shall last for a period of five years subject to renewal.
- (2) Allocation of hunting block made by the Minister under these Regulations shall be within the period of a hunting term.
  - (3) Unless the tenure of a hunting block has been renewed,

hunting companies shall cease to operate and vacate the hunting block at the end of each hunting term.

Renewal of allocation of a hunting block

- **16**.-(1) The Minister shall, by 31<sup>st</sup> December, of the third year of the hunting term, invite hunting companies intending to renew the tenure of ownership of the hunting block to submit their applications.
- (2) The application for renewal of a hunting block allocation under sub-regulation (1) shall be made in the prescribed form set out in the First Schedule to these Regulations and submitted to the Director.
- (3) The Director shall submit the applications for renewal referred to under sub-regulation (1) to the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee.
- (4) The Hunting Block Advisory Committee shall evaluate the application for renewal in consideration of the following:
  - (a) whether the applicant has been utilizing the hunting block allocated to him and score at least fourty percent of the value of the key animals as specified in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations per hunting season;
  - (b) the level of revenue collected from photographic tourism depending on the category of the hunting block;
  - (c) whether the applicant has been contributing to the villages within and adjacent to his hunting block an amount of not less than USD 5,000.00 for each hunting block annually as contribution to the implementation of various community development projects;
  - (d) the level of the applicant's contribution to the improvement of infrastructure and protection of the environment within his hunting block;
  - (e) the level of the applicant's contribution towards antipoaching operations or any other bad intentioned persons in issues of conservation of wildlife; and
  - (f) the applicant's record regarding the export of trophies to relevant clients.
- (5) The calculations of points stipulated under paragraph (a) of sub regulation (4) shall be as set out in Eighth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (6) The Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee shall, for the purpose of carrying out an evaluation of the performance of the hunting company which was allocated a hunting block through transfer, incorporate the scores that were attained by the transferor with respect to the hunting block transferred.
- (7) A hunting company that is allocated a hunting block after the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee has conducted an

- evaluation of the performance of the hunting companies, shall not be eligible for renewal of the hunting block.
- (8) The Minister may, upon receiving advise from the Hunting Block Allocation Advisory Committee, grant or refuse to grant a renewal of the hunting block.
- (9) Where the Minister makes a decision under sub-regulation (8), he shall inform the applicant accordingly and give him the reasons for the decision.
- (10) Where the Minister refuses to grant a renewal of the hunting term, the unsuccessful applicant shall vacate and handover the hunting block to the Director on the last day of hunting term.

#### Cancellation of allocation

- 17.-(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 16, the Minister may at any time before the expiration of the period of one term, cancel the allocation of hunting block made under these Regulations.
- (2) The Minister shall, before exercising his powers to cancel the allocation of the hunting block under sub-regulation (1)-
  - (a) ensure that there is sufficient evidence that a person allocated a hunting block-
    - (i) fails to satisfy any or a combination of any of the conditions which the Director requires to take into consideration;
    - (ii) commits an offence under the Act whereby the Minister deems it in the public interest proper to cancel the allocation; or
    - (iii) fails to pay necessary fees in the prescribed period or any other debt due to him in relation to tourist hunting activities;
  - (b) ensure that a person concerned is granted a right or an opportunity to be heard in relation to his conduct of the hunting activities.
- (3) A person aggrieved by the decision of the Minister under this regulation, may appeal to the High Court within thirty days.

#### Vacant hunting blocks

#### **18**.-(1) The Minister:

- (a)shall, where there is no appeal against cancellation of allocation under regulation 17, declare a relevant hunting block as vacant and ready for re-allocation; and
- (b) may, where the appeal has been lodged declare a hunting block vacant after obtaining advise from the Attorney General.
- (2) Where a hunting block is declared vacant under subregulation (1) a person whose allocation is cancelled shall, within twenty one days after the declaration, vacate the hunting block.

(3) Any person who contravenes sub-regulation (2) shall be disqualified from obtaining any licences or permits for conducting tourist hunting and shall not be eligible to own or be allocated any hunting block.

Conditions to tourist hunting GN. No. 230 of 2010

- **19**.-(1) A hunting company which is a holder of a hunting block certificate shall:
  - (a) obtain a trophy dealer's license as per the Wildlife Conservation (Dealing in Trophies) Regulations, 2010.
  - (b) subject to sub regulation (2), conduct tourist hunting activities within the hunting block allocated to him, and within the period in which his certificate is valid.
  - (c) ensure that only the persons approved by the Director participate in the hunting activities during any safari package.
- (2) Except where a presidential licence is issued or where the Director has upon payment of the fees stipulated in the Fifth Schedule, approved an agreement to conduct intercompany hunting and issued an additional hunting permit.
- (3) A person other than the holder of hunting block allocation certificate for a given block shall not be allowed to enter any hunting block to conduct tourist hunting.
- (4) Notwithstanding sub regulation (3), any authorized officer may, at any time enter any hunting block for the purpose of carrying out any of the duties or exercising the powers or privilege conferred to him by or under the Act.
- (5) The observer shall be above the age of twelve years and for a child not less than five years shall be allowed as observer when accompanied by the parent.
- (6) For the purpose of this regulation "intercompany hunting" means a situation where the Director has issued an additional hunting permit to a hunting company to conduct hunting in a hunting block belonging to another company for the purpose of enabling a hunting client to obtain species not hunted in its allocated hunting block.

Tourist Hunting

- **20**.-(1) Trophy hunting shall be conducted during the period specified by the Minister under section 28 of the Act.
- (2) A hunting company shall ensure that a tourist hunter, in conducting his hunting activities within a given hunting block, be accompanied by a duly licensed professional hunter and a Wildlife Officer or a certified village game scout if such block falls under the management of an Authorized Association:

Provided that if the tourist hunter is a licenced professional hunter issued under these Regulations, he may not be required to be accompanied by a licenced professional hunter.

- (3) Application for a trophy hunting permit shall be made in the prescribed form set out in the Sixth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (4) The Director shall, where he is satisfied with the application made under sub-regulation (3), issue a trophy hunting permit to the applicant in the form as prescribed in the Seventh Schedule to these Regulations stating the restrictions or condition regarding the activities of the applicant.
- (5) The hunting permit shall be issued in accordance with the safari packages as prescribed in the Sixth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (6) The Director shall prepare a guideline indicating the animal species and number to be included in each safari package.
- (7) Any observer accompanying the tourist hunter shall be required to pay an observer fee for the days of the safari package.
- (8) Fees and other charges shall be as set out in the Fifth and Ninth Schedules to these Regulations.
- (9) Tourist hunting permit issued under this regulation shall not be transferred to any other person without the consent of the Director.
- (10) The hunting permit shall indicate the name of the professional hunter and all observers accompanying the hunting client.
- (11) Any person who makes false declaration while applying for a permit or licence, commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine of not less than one million shillings or to imprisonment for a term of not less than six months or to both.
  - (12) Notwithstanding the provisions of this regulation-
  - (a) each tourist hunting company shall pay game fees within forty two days after the expiry of a hunting permit;
  - (b) without prejudice to regulation 19(3) a hunting permit shall be restricted to hunting blocks allocated to a particular operator.

Notice of cancellation of a hunting safari

- **21**.-(1) A request for cancellation of a hunting permit shall not be allowed except under the following conditions:
  - (a) proof of cancellation of the hunting safari by the hunting client;
  - (b) the notice of the cancellation should reach the Director not less than fifteen days before the commencement of the safari.
- (2) The Director shall upon approving the request for cancellation:
  - (a) retain fifteen percent of the fees paid;
  - (b) utilize the remaining fees to cover other fees prescribed under these Regulations as the hunting company directs.

Permits to be surrendered

- **22.**-(1) Any person granted a hunting permit under these Regulations, shall within forty two days after the expiry of the hunting permit, surrender the permit to the Director, and shall be required to pay all the relevant outstanding fees.
- (2) Any person who contravenes the provision of sub-regulation (1) commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine of not less than one million Shillings or to imprisonment for a term not less than six months or both such fine or imprisonment.

## PART IV MANAGEMENT AND SUPERVISION OF PROFESSIONAL HUNTERS

Director to issue Professional Hunter license

- **23**.-(1) No person shall guide a hunting client during a hunting safari unless he has a professional hunter licence obtained from the Director upon payment of the fees prescribed in the Fifth Schedule.
- (2) Any person intending to become a professional hunter shall submit a formal application to the Director in the form prescribed in the Ninth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (3) The Director shall before issuing a professional hunter licence ensure that the applicant has the qualifications stipulated in section 48(2) of the Act and has passed the professional hunter examination for the category applied for.
- (4) The Director shall establish a Professional Hunters Examination Committee responsible for examining applicants of professional hunter licenses.
- (5) The Director shall upon satisfying himself that the applicant meets the requirements stipulated under sub-regulation (3) issue a professional hunter licence in a form prescribed in the Tenth Schedule to these Regulations upon payment of the fees prescribed in the Fifth Schedule.
- (6) The professional hunter licence shall be divided in two categories as follows:
  - (a) category A licence which shall authorize the holder to supervise the hunting of any animal; and
  - (b) category B which shall allow the holder to supervise hunting of non dangerous animals.
- (7) Subject to the provision of sub-regulation (3), where the Director refuses to issue a license, he shall, notify the applicant by giving him reasons for the refusal.
- (8) Any person aggrieved by the refusal under this regulation may, within thirty days of receipt of the refusal of the licence appeal to the Minister
- (9) A professional hunter shall be allowed to guide up to two hunting clients within the same hunting safari provided that the hunting is conducted in the same hunting block.

## PART V MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

## Control of hunting quota

- **24**.-(1) The hunting company shall not be allowed to reduce the animal quota allocated to it after the commencement of the hunting season.
  - (2) Every hunting company shall:
  - (a) not exceed the hunting quota issued to the company;
  - (b) control hunting quota within its hunting block; and
  - (c) unless he shows reasons for non exportation, export all trophies from hunted animals within a period of eighteen months after the end of each hunting season, failure of which the operator shall pay a surcharge fee of ten percent of the value of the trophies hunted and export the trophies within a period of six months.
- (3) Any person who contravenes the provision of sub-regulation (2)(a) and (b) commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine of five million shillings or imprisonment for a term of one year or both.
- (4) Any person who contravenes the provision of sub-regulation (2)(c), commits an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine of one million shillings or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to both and the trophies shall be surrender to the Government.

### Offences and penalties

- **25**.-(1) Without prejudice to section 65 of the Act, no person shall-
  - (a) in hunting an animal, use any firearm which after it has been discharged, automatically reloads and fires when the trigger thereof is pulled or held in a discharged position;
  - (b) hunt any animal during the hours of darkness or the period between sunset and sunrise;
  - (c) hunt within one kilometer from an aerodrome:
  - (d) leave on any hunting site, litter, refuse, unburnt trophy, drying racks or a burning fire or leave such site in a state likely to constitute a danger to the public or animal health;
  - (e) hunt the young of any animal or any female animal;
  - (f) hunt any animal except in accordance with the condition of a valid hunting permit issued to him;
  - (g) hunt any specified animal except in accordance with the written authority of the Director previously sought and obtained,
  - (h) except with the written authority of the Director previously sought and obtained hunt beyond the boundaries of the hunting block allocated to him.

- (i) hunt, bait and establish camps within one kilometers from a boundary of a National Park or the Ngorongoro Conservation Area: or
- (j) leave any animal carcass within a kilometer of any aerodrome, or any public road, lodge, hotel or zoo.
- (2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of subregulation (1) commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine of not less than three million shillings, or imprisonment for a term not less than one year or to both.

Offence in contravenetion of standard set

- **26.-**(1) The Director shall set standards of quality and size of tourist hunting trophies.
- (2) Any professional hunter who guides a client to hunt in contravention of the provision of sub-regulation (1) commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine equivalent to twice the game fee of the animal so hunted and seizure of the trophies.
- (3) A professional hunter who is convicted under this subregulation for the third time shall on top of paying the prescribed penalty be liable to cancellation of the professional Hunters' licence.
- (4) Without prejudice to sub-regulation (1), a person shall hunt an elephant whose one of the tusks weighs 20 kgs and above or measures 160cm and above.
- (5) A professional hunter who guides a client to hunt an elephant in contravention of this sub-regulation commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a fine stipulated under regulation 27(2).

## Offence for hunting

- **27.-**(1) Without prejudice to sub-regulation 26(1), no person shall:
  - (a) hunt a lion of an age below six years and if such person hunts a lion below the age of six years on top of the fine prescribed under sub-regulation (2), the Director shall order the following:
    - (i) where the lion hunted is of the age of four or five years allow the exportation of the hunted trophy; and
    - (ii) where the lion hunted is below the age of four years confiscate the hunted trophy.
  - (b) hunt leopard whose length from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail is less than 150cm:
  - (c) hunt a crocodile whose length from the nose to the tip of the tail is less than 300 cm;
- (2) Any Professional hunter who guides a Client to hunt any animal in contravention of regulation 26(5) and sub-regulation (1) commits an offence and is liable on conviction:
  - (a) to a fine of US Dollars Two Thousand Five Hundred or

- imprisonment for a term not less than six months for the first time of commission of an offence;
- (b) to a fine of US Dollars five thousand or imprisonment for a term not less than one year for the second time of commission of an offence; and
- (c) to a fine of US Dollars ten thousand or imprisonment for a term not less than one year and cancellation of the Professional Hunters' license for the third time of commission of an offence.
- (3) No person shall conduct tourist hunting, game viewing, photographic safari, walking safari or any wildlife based tourist safari within a hunting block or within any wildlife protected area outside Ngorongoro Conservation Area, and National Park except in accordance with the written authority of the Director previously sought and obtained:

Provided that this sub-regulation shall not apply where such activities are conducted in a Wildlife Management Area or in a private captive breeding operation which has been endorsed by the Director.

- (4) Any person who contravenes the provision of sub-regulation (8) commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine of not less than one million shillings and not more than three million shillings or to imprisonment for a term of less than six months but not exceeding one year or to both.
- (5) A professional hunter shall immediately after every hunt, fill and sign the Register of animals killed or wounded as prescribed in the Eleventh Schedule to these Regulations and ensure that it is verified and signed by the hunting client and the Wildlife Officer or Village Game Scout who accompanied and monitored the hunting activities and submit the form to the Director together with the Hunting Permit.

General Penalty **28**. A person who contravenes the provisions of these Regulations for which no specific penalty is prescribed, commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five million shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

Revocation of GN. No. 229 of 2010

- **29**.-(1) The Wildlife Conservation (Tourist Hunting) Regulations, 2010 are hereby revoked.
- (2) Notwithstanding the revocation made under subregulation (1) anything done or any action taken or purported to have been done or any permit, certificate, licence issued under the revoked regulations shall be deemed to have been done or issued, as the case may be under the provisions of these Regulations.
